
NBC News Poll: November 2023 Headlines



The proportion of American voters who feel confident that life for our children's generation will be better than it has been for us. This is a record low going back to 1990.



Joe Biden's job approval rating, the lowest of his presidency.



Donald Trump's support on the ballot test with Biden, ahead by two points. This is the first time Trump has been ahead of Biden in any NBC News polling in 2019, 2020, or 2023.



The percentage of 18 to 34 year old voters who oppose providing more funding and military aid to Israel. This is 41 points higher opposition than among voters 65 and older, an unusually large gap in policy preferences by generation.



The percentage of 18 to 29 year old voters on TikTok once a day or more. Twenty percent of all voters use TikTok this often as social media sites become more of a source for news and information.



2023: Mourning in America

A RECORD HIGH 73% of Americans for the year say that the direction of the country is off on the wrong track. We have not seen this level of sustained pessimism in the history of the NBC News Poll going back to 1989.

A RECORD HIGH 69% of Americans use negative words like downhill, disaster/hard times, or wrong track to describe where America is headed in the next year.

A RECORD LOW 19% of Americans feel confident that life for our children's generation will be better than it has been for us. This is the lowest number ever in over thirty years.

Majorities of voters believe that Joe Biden (70%) and Donald Trump (60%) SHOULD NOT run for president.


For Americans who say they are doing WORSE than expected at this stage in their life, they are focused on negative economic circumstances and inflation.







President Biden's numbers are weaker than Trump's a year before the election.





Core Supporters: Approve of job as president AND positive image rating
Core opponents: Disapprove of job as president AND negative image rating
Balance: The remaining 15% who are not core supporters or core opponents

A year before the election, President Biden has the lowest job approval of any incumbent running for re-election in NBC News polling history. Job approval tends to go down, not up. Within roughly the margin-of-error, final job approval is a pretty good predictor of the incumbent's vote.




National 2024 Ballot... Multiple surveys showing softer numbers for President Biden among younger voters since the Israel/Hamas war.





Wide majorities of voters disapprove of Biden's handling of foreign policy and the war between Israel and Hamas.


