


NBC News Poll: January 2024 Headlines






Joe Biden's job rating is the lowest of his presidency, and the lowest for any president in the NBC Poll since George W. Bush's second term. (Trump's low was 39%.)



Share of voters who believe that Donald Trump will do a better job at being competent and effective than Joe Biden (32%). In 2020, Biden had a 9-point advantage on this measure (47% to 38%).



The proportion of voters who say that Donald Trump is better in dealing with the economy than Joe Biden (33%). This 22-point advantage is the largest of any candidate in the NBC Poll's history back to 1992.



A 14-point drop in the share of voters who say the nation's economy will get worse over the next 12 months. Voters still believe the economy will get worse than better (36% to 24%), but this is significant improvement to track.



The proportion of voters who have negative views about The Supreme Court, a 12-point gap compared to the 28% who have positive feelings – the Court's lowest ratings in the NBC Poll's history.









Donald Trump has opened up a commanding lead over Nikki Haley among Republican primary voters, 79% to 19%. Haley's negative rating among primary voters has climbed from 17% in November to 36% today, with a 45% negative rating among very conservative primary voters.



Donald Trump's lead over Joe Biden has increased to five points, 47% to 42%. Since last June, Biden's support has dropped seven points from 49% to 42%.



Republicans enjoy a four-point advantage (49% Republican - 45% Democrat) on congressional preference. This is only the third time this century Republicans have had an advantage this large (four points in January of 2002/six points in August 2011).


